ANTI-HARASSMENT, ANTI-INTIMIDATION OR ANTI-BULLYING model Policy Per House Bill 276 Approved by the State Board of Education, July 10, 2007.

2.2.9-A requirement that the district administrators semi-annually provide the president of the district board a written summary of all reported incidents and post the summary on the district Web site, to the extent permitted by section 3319.321 of the Revised Code and the "Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974." 88 Stat. 571.20 U.S.C. 1232g, as amended, have access to any written reports pertaining to the prohibited incident.

The administration used the Scioto County CTC's Discipline Referral Forms as a guideline for considering bullying incidences. The following is a list of code of conduct numerals and the explanation in conjunction with each of the offenses used in determining bullying situations.

- #3 A student shall not cause, attempt to cause or behave in a manner that could cause physical injury to anyone.

- #6 A student shall not engage in any act (written, verbal or gestured) which frightens, degrades, disgraces or harasses a fellow student, or any other person.

- #20 Any person possessing, taking, disseminating or sharing nude, obscene, pornographic. Lewd or otherwise illegal images or photographs may be punished under this code of conduct.
