




A Brief History of Our School: The Scioto County Joint Vocational School District began accepting high school and adult students in 1971. In 2007, the district changed it name to the Scioto County Career Technical Center. Students can choose from 17 secondary programs and 14 post secondary programs. In addition, the district sustains 14 secondary satellite programs located at our associate school districts.

Mr. Richard's classes held a mock election on November 8th.




Learn about BPA

In the championship game the juniors (pictured right) beat the seniors with a final score of 16-14












