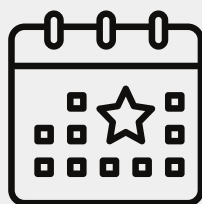

Weekly Questions

Polls conducted with 62 senior students

This Weeks Question:

Do you participate in any sports or extracurricular activities like clubs?

Out of 62 participants:

- *34% of students said they participate in sports and clubs*
- *66% said they do not*

Out of the ones that answered:

- *68% said they do a sport*
- *32% say they are in a club*

Four students overall said they do both.

A poll was taken among the senior class to determine how they feel about school dances:

Students answered:

OVERALL NEUTRAL

- *24% felt POSITIVE about school dances*
- *40% felt NEUTRAL on their opinion*
- *10% felt NEGATIVE about school dances*
- *26% were MIXED in their responses*

We also asked students how long it takes them to get to school:

Out of 62 students:

21% of students take 5 min to 15 min to get to school

60% of students take 15 min to 30 min to get to school

11% of students take 30 min to an hour to get to school

8% of students take over an hour to get to school
